

12 March 2024

Church Hill Park

The primary task was dam building, to slow the stream down, but this was not undertaken because of rain and general muddy conditions. The stream was very full and flowing quite fast. A very large pile of rubbish, including some challenging items such as a bicycle and scooter, was collected and taken away by the ranger, and selected trees were cut down.

The weather was very wet, with almost continuous rain, but it did improve late morning.

We had a fairly low turnout of 12 volunteers.



19 March 2024 Nine Mile Ride (Madingley)

The task was to plant trees by the boundary of houses along Nine Mile Ride either side of a large wood. Trees were hazel, guelder rose, crab apple and hawthorn. A variety of mixed trees were planted along the Ramblers Route.
